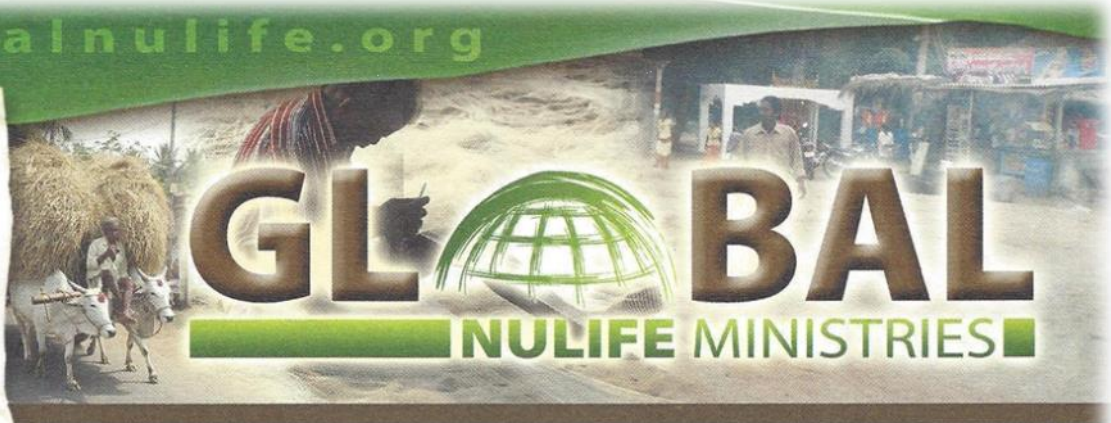

I am so thankful for the many wonderful generous people we have and being able to connect with them again. I rode the Amtrak train to Salem, where Gateway Church is joining with another church in their large building. I was hosted by retired pastors Phil and Marty Hale, which was special.

A highlight was attending a special "Hymn Sing" hosted by my sister Lily and Bob with their team of singers and musicians. Top trumpet player Bob Wager played with Lil, in spite of battling cancer. I met many old friends at this special evening. Meeting with my nephews and nieces was also a special time both in Vancouver and Seattle.

The work in India continues to grow and many are coming to Christ, transformed by His power and water baptized. We now have five children from Yenada village in our House of Hope Children's Home. We are sending a team of six volunteers again in January 2025 from N.Z., led by Athol Graham. I have met these special people and know they will be a great blessing to our people in Andhra Pradesh. Unfortunately, they will not be visiting our other places, mostly because of lack of time and also the expense. Please pray for much fruit from this visit and for their protection. Thank you so much for your faithful prayers and support.

The situation in India is changing rapidly as Hindu fanatics oppose outdoor meetings and cause division among the people. A large church building near us was demolished recently. Please pray that our ministry will flourish in spite of it all. Prayer changes things. Thank you all.
